Numbers include "Blame It on My Youth," "It's Easy to Remember," "The End of a Love Affair," etc. As usual, Nelson Riddle acquires himself in top style in the arranger-conductor slot. Load up on these because they'll move fast.

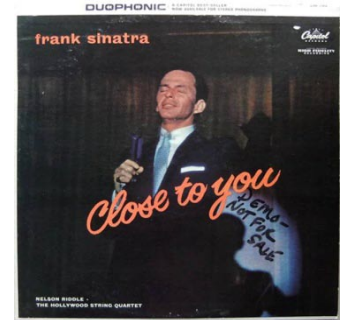
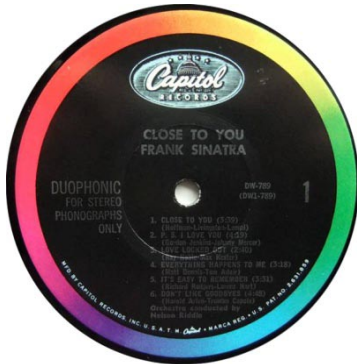
