

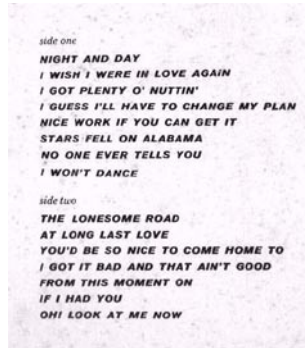

Earlier copies have the credits for the sixth and seventh songs on side 1 written out on one line each. Later copies split those credits into two lines and add a blank line above the artist's name.

Some copies of this pressing are housed in covers that have back liners showing the original lineup of the album, beginning with "The Lonesome Road" and containing "The Lady is a Tramp" instead of "No One Ever Tells You."

Black label with color band. Logo at left. Spires extend up and down from the Capitol logo. Some copies were pressed in England and imported. These have "Made in England" on the label.



The album was reissued in 1962 in mono and Duophonic. Three songs were removed from the LP, and the song titles were added to the front cover.
