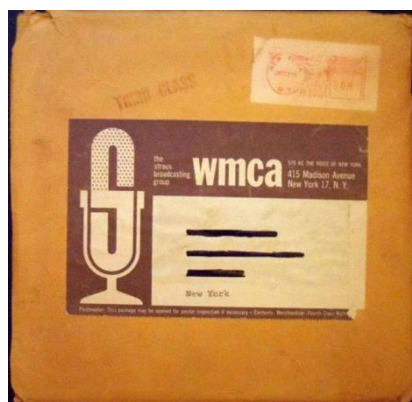

### BEATLEMANIA HITS U.S.

#### Jack Paar To Get Beatles Film

NEW YORK—The Beatles will make their American debut on film on the Jack Paar Show of Jan. 3, it was announced last week.

Britain's foremost rock and roll group will make its live debut on the Ed Sullivan show on CBS on Feb. 9 and have a repeat performance on the 16th with a third appearance to be taped for showing at a later date. Their first appearance will emanate from New York and the second from Florida.

Capitol Records' Brown Meggs announced that their premier single for the label, "I Want To Hold Your Hand," would be released Dec. 26 instead of mid-January as originally scheduled. Release date for the group's first LP, "Meet The Beatles," has been moved up to Jan. from Feb.

#### Beatles To Make UA Film

HOLLYWOOD — Producer Walter Shenson and United Artists Corporation have concluded an agreement with Britain's "The Beatles," for a feature film to be filmed in London in early '64.

The singing group, currently holding down the number one spot in the disk industry in England, have been sought by many film producers and distributors for a picture commitment.

Shenson and UA, who recently teamed in the production, "Mouse On The Moon," have assigned the script writing to playwright Alun Owen, and Richard Lester will direct.

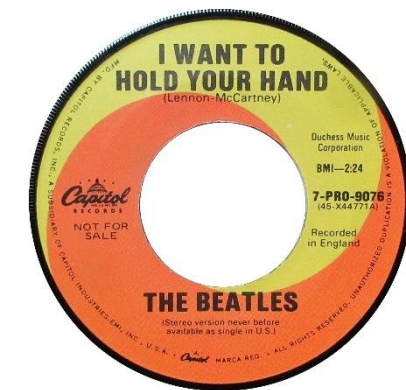
