Reissued as *Early in the Morning* – a title that remained as long as the album was in print. Capitol had released their single as “Down by the Station” (Capitol 4312), and although the Four Preps were performing a cover version of that song with new lyrics, all later copies of the song and album appear as “Early in the Morning” – including the song’s title on their greatest hits collection from 1967 (Capitol ST-2708). Based on the mono slogan at the bottom of the back cover, the title change came either later after June in 1960, or in 1961.

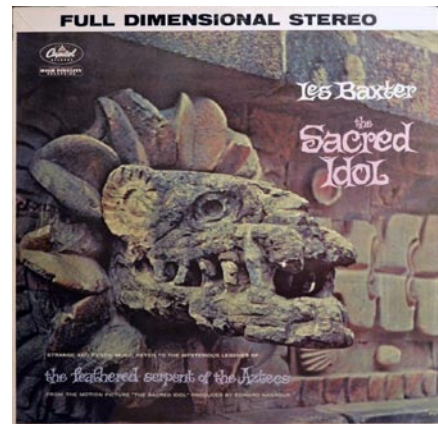
