

The stereo pressing of this LP was part of the second batch of stereo albums that Capitol released commercially. The stereo album always had ten songs instead of twelve. The first stereo covers had back slicks (folded over to the front) reading "Capitol stereo record \* the full spectrum of sound." All later copies dropped the word "record" and greatly magnified the size of the word STEREO.




