The print on LA singles is slightly larger than the print on Scranton singles, and the printing is aligned slightly differently. Both sides of the single bubbled under the top 100 briefly in 1968. After that the record disappeared for almost three years.



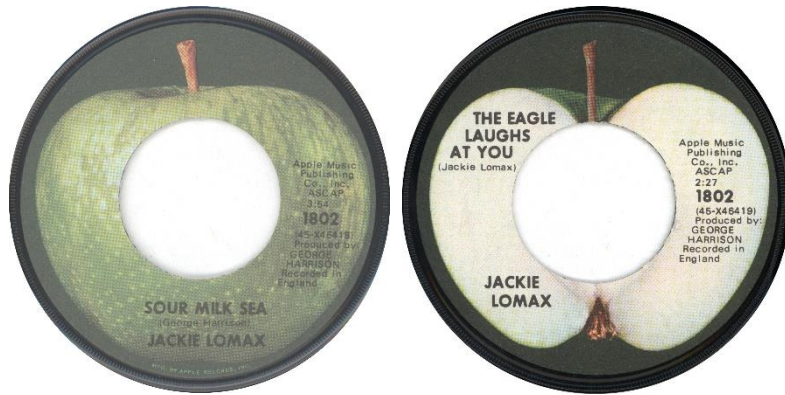
Jackie Lomax

In June 1971, the A-side was reissued in stereo along with another Lomax song, "(I) Fall Inside Your Eyes," as Apple 1834. That single sold modestly. While it may make more sense for this reissue single to have appeared on the market April or May of 1971, the label positioning and matrix information seem to suggest a date in late 1973. This single has the B-side's authorship correctly credited to Jackie Lomax; the earlier release had erroneously credited it to George Harrison. Both sides are published by Apple Music Publishing on the later pressing instead of Python Music on the original.
