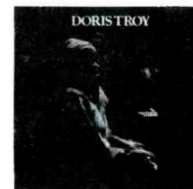

Cover:

The front-cover artwork was colored with a shade of purple on the American pressing; however, on the UK printings of the cover (APPLE SAPCOR-13), the tinting was a light shade of blue. (John) Kosh's back-cover design was also altered by replacing the white silhouetted Apple logo with the more common green Apple logo – an apple that now dominates the image.

Ooh wee! Doris Troy and a group of unnamed sidemen (we can guess, though) have put together a rock 'em sock 'em no holds barred session that from the opening bars of "Ain't That Cute," tenaciously grabs on to your ear canals and refuses to let go until the last notes of "Jacob's Ladder." Most of the songs were written by Doris with either George Harrison or Jackie Lomax, but "Special Care" is a Steve Stills number and both "Gonna Get My Baby Back" and "You Give Me Joy Joy" were written by the unlikely team of Troy/Harrison/Starkey/Stills. Standouts: "Hurry," and "So Far." And Doris: oh, those vocals!

DORIS TROY—Apple ST 3371 (S)

Doris Troy, like Billy Preston, seems to have more control over her disks than she had in the U.S., as this soulful lady produced her own LP, enjoying full contemporary rock and blues accompaniment plus material by George Harrison, Jackie Lomax, Steve Stills, Klaus Vorman, all with whom she collaborates. The blues are first-rate, so are the back-up musicians, and Miss Troy rises to the occasion on "Give Me Back My Dynamite," "Games People Play" and "Jacob's Ladder." A top sleeper.
