In the July 4, 1970, issues, the trade magazines reviewed the single. *Billboard* received it mildly, and it seemed to confuse *Cash Box*, whose reviewer remarked about its “radical shift in style.” This was the leadoff single to the group’s first album for Warner/Reprise. It did not chart, slipping on through into oblivion.

Group's power is channeled into a more contemporary and less distinctively BB mannerism that should ignite sales even more brightly than their first Reprise venture. Flip: “This Whole World” (2:00) (Brother, BMI — B. Wilson) More of a transitional piece, this side deserves extra consideration as the plug track.
