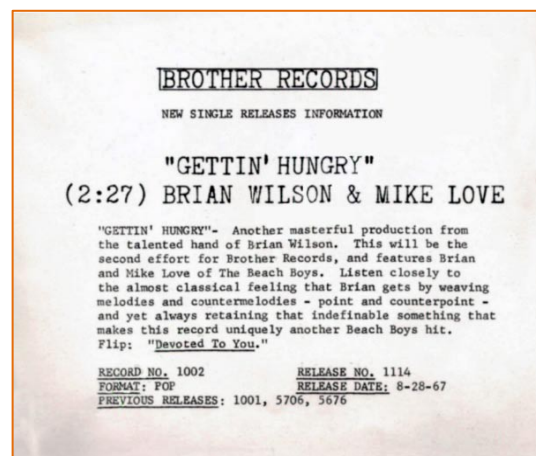

The trade magazines introduced the new record in the September 2, 1967, issues, and Capitol took out a full-page ad the following week. The artwork for that ad was destined to appear on the picture sleeve to the Dutch release of the single, but Brother/Capitol did not issue a picture sleeve in the United States. The single did not chart, quickly vanishing from the list of available records.
