Label 01L(i) has little blank space above the author credit; no blank line above BMI; on the A-side the C in Clockus is over the “Mu” in Music.

Label 01L(ii) has little blank space above the author credit; no blank line above BMI; on the A-side the C in Clockus is over the “us” in Music.

Label 01L(iii) has little blank space above the author credit; there is a blank line above BMI; there is more space on both sides between the lines of the publishing information and below “Produced by.”

Label 01L(iv) has more blank space above the author credit; there is a blank line above BMI.

Label 01L(v) has little blank space above the author credit; there is a blank line above BMI.

BEACH BOYS—DO YOU WANNA DANCE (Clockus, BMI)—**PLEASE LET ME WONDER** (Sea of Tunes, BMI)—Bobby Freeman's former hit serves as a hot follow up to the Beach Boy's "Dance Dance Dance." Flip is an interesting and well done change of pace ballad. **Capitol 5372**

The single debuted in *Billboard* on February 27th after being reviewed on the 20th. It achieved #12 status on April 10th before dropping out of the chart. An ad on the 27th indicated that their new LP would be out on March 1st, but the album was delayed. *Cash Box* agreed, having the single top out on April 3rd at #13. This record was not reissued in its original form, but in 1966 the A-side was reissued together with "Help Me Rhonda" as Capitol Star Line 6081.

Picture Sleeve

PS1A(east coast):

The sleeve has a straight-cut top on the open side.

PS1Aa has the A-side on top on the open side of the sleeve.

PS1Ab has the B-side on top on the open side of the sleeve. This version is much more common.



PS1B (west coast):

The sleeve is tab cut.

The A-side is on top on the tabbed side of the sleeve.
