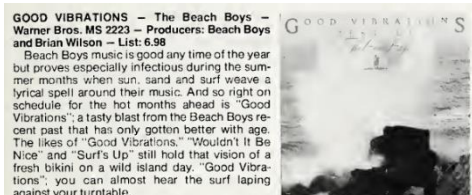

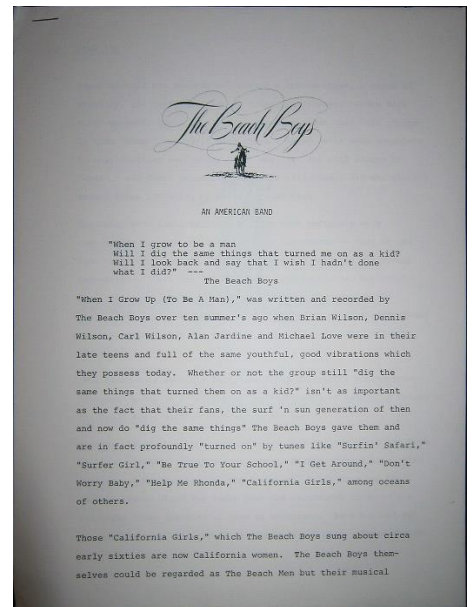
Brown Reprise label with Warner Communications logo in the rim print.

Most copies seem to have been pressed by Goldisc.





Some copies, possibly prepared by Monarch, show the zip code as 91505. Otherwise, these have the same layout as the copies that properly read 91510. I have verified this backdrop variation on two other Reprise albums from the period, both of which were Monarch copies. However, the copies of these LPs are Goldisc pressings that are otherwise identical to the 91510 copies above.
