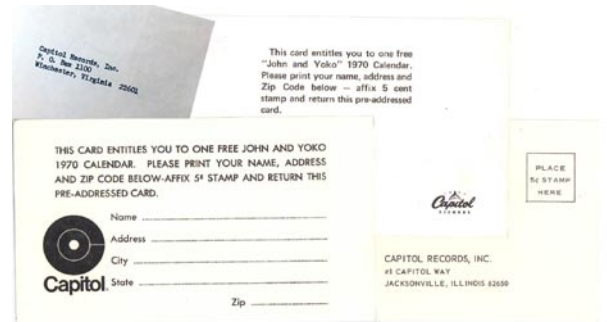

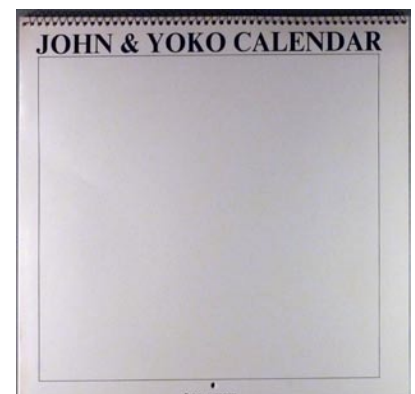
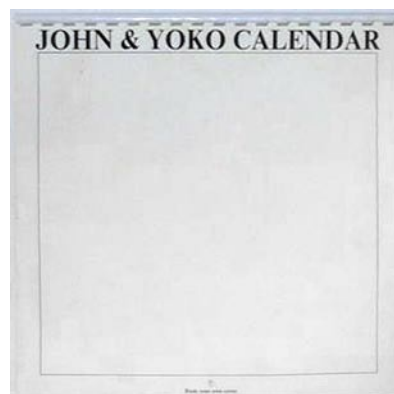

**LIVE PEACE IN TORONTO 1969 — Plastic Ono Band — Apple 3362**  
The Plastic Ono Band (John Lennon, guitar, vocals; Yoko Ono, vocals; Eric Clapton, guitar; Klaus Voorman, bass guitar; and Alan White, drums) offers its debut album. Lennon dominates Side One, which contains three oldies — "Blue Suede Shoes", "Money" and "Dizzy Miss Lizzie" — two Lennon-McCartney songs — "Yer Blues" and "Give Peace A Chance" — and the Ono Band's single hit, Lennon's "Cold Turkey". Yoko Ono dominates Side Two with two of her own compositions, of which the listener may make what sense he can. LP is bound to be on the charts soon.
