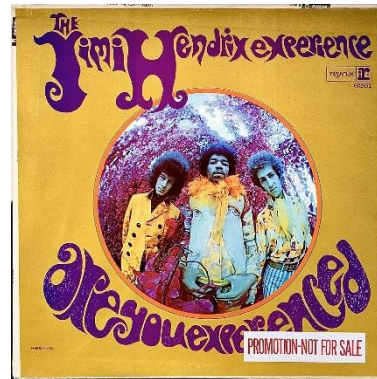

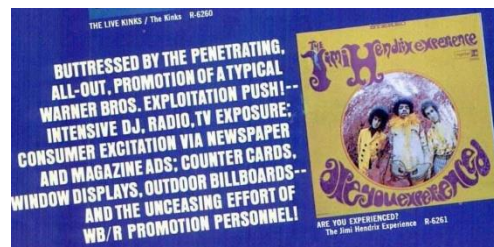

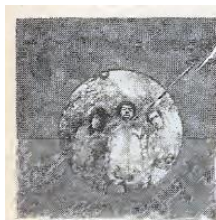

From 1976 to 1986, the album was pressed by Capitol Records for Warner Brothers.



In about 1977, Capitol reversed the size of the front and back cover slicks, so that the front cover wraps around to the back.



By 1978, Capitol was using posterboard covers instead of cardboard covers with paper slicks. These covers returned Warner Brothers' "stereo" designation to the upper right corner of the back cover.



In approximately 1984, Capitol added a Universal Product Code to the album's back cover.

From 1986 on, copies made for the Columbia Record Club appear. These have either the original layout and Columbia markings on the cover and label, or a new layout and Columbia House on the cover only.
