Star Line Label SL69

At approximately the same time that the main line Capitol label added the subsidiary print, near the end of 1968, they also revised the backdrop on the Star Line album label so that it resembles a star rather than a target. The singles label stayed on the earlier red-and-white target label until 1972, but from this point on, the singles labels had the same “subsidiary” print that one finds on the main line Capitol singles.

As attractive as the star label was, it appeared to be “crowded.”
