Although Witherspoon released singles on Atco, although Atco announced in early January that Witherspoon would be releasing an album on that label, and although de Paris and Witherspoon had recorded all ten songs prior to the initial announcement, when the album finally appeared in shops eight months later, it was on the Atlantic label. So, it appears that the first Atco LP was on Atlantic.





A great album. The material comprises classic blues, played with great heart by the band and sung with supreme poignancy by Witherspoon. Musically, the performances represent a combination of New Orleans and Kansas City influences. The vocals are interspersed by long, relaxed periods of instrumentation-much in the fashion of Atlantic's "Joe Turner Sings Kansas City Blues" album. In fact, buyers of that package will be imable to resist this one, which contains some of the same great sougs, such as "How Long Blues," St. Louis Blues, etc. Dealers should take the trouble to demonstrate the package; there's not a mediocre band on it.

NEW YORK—A Bobby Darin Xmas LP on Atco—"The 25th Day of December"—is the feature of five LP's just released by Atlantic Records. Three other releases are on the Atlantic label, while the remaining LP is on Trey.

The Darin effort—a collection of Yuletide hymns and spirituals — is packaged in a gold aluminum foil package. Atco has already released a single from the set, "Child Of God."






