The first ten albums were not numbered at first. Columbia seems to have applied numbers to the existing albums in their catalog after CBS purchased Columbia in December, 1938. There are no known numbered copies of any of the first ten albums except for those having the new CBS microphone logo.


C-8 Bessie Smith



Contains ten records with no catalog numbers, but with matrix numbers ME 1025-ME 1044. Recorded in June, 1938. Released in late 1938.




