The Scepter/Wand albums that came out prior to August 1964 were advertised in mono only and appeared in the shops in mono only. Scepter's full-page ad in the August 8th issue of *Billboard* changed that. The ad referred to three new upcoming Wand albums (659 and 660) and three new Scepter albums (522, 523, and 9001) – all of which were coming out in both mono and stereo.

Not long thereafter, Scepter/Wand contracted with Columbia Records to press and distribute their records. From that point on, most Scepter albums used the prefix SRM- for mono and SPS- for stereo. Wand albums were prefixed WDM- (mono) and WDS- (stereo). This prefixing continued until mono records were phased out in 1968. After that time, Scepter/Wand typically used an "X" instead of an M or and S.

As Scepter was rolling out stereo albums, many of the earlier records were reissued with (true or rechanneled) stereo counterparts. The records on this page, however, came out in mono only when they were first released.

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
