—Everybody Knows This Is Nowhere. Reprise RS 6349 (S)
Neil Young comes into his own as a solo performer in this, his second Reprise album. The former member of Buffalo Springfield has a group of fine compositions here and he sings them richly. "Down by the River" is solid in a gospel vein, while "The Losing End (When You're On)" is more country. The title number and "Cinnamon Girl" are among the other strong cuts.

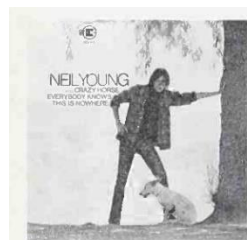

The second album by Neil Young since he left the Buffalo Springfield, this set finds the singer/composer back on the right track. With the aid of Crazy Horse, his new backup group, Young runs through seven of his own compositions, and the result should please old fans and win new ones. Of special interest is the over-nine-minute "Down By The River," but all the songs sit well, including "Round & Round (It Won't Be Long)" and "Cowgirl In The Sand."

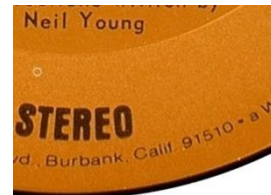

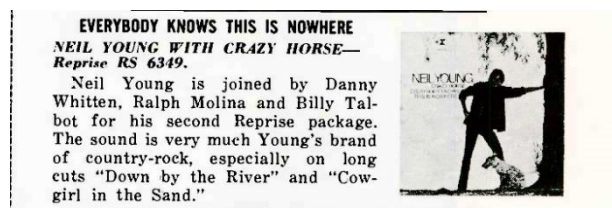

The RIAA awarded a Gold Record to the album in late November 1970, as reported in the issue of *Billboard* dated December 5th.

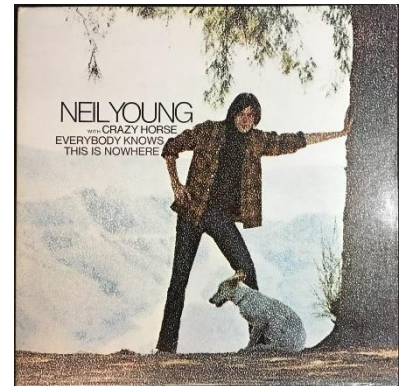

The bar code sports the number 7599-27242-1. This number is the number associated with the Warner/Reprise reissue in the Compact Disc format. Warner introduced the CD in June, 1987, so that the reissue album with the bar code comes from 1987.
