McCartney split from Capitol to join Columbia and this first release on his new label marks another departure for Wings: this single with its percussion undercurrents and muscular bass playing is likely to receive disco play. Acoustic and electric guitars offer interesting flourishes. This is an unusual effort for McCartney.

McCartney's first release WINGS after 15 years on Capitol is an odd disco tinged track emphasizing strange experimental sound effects. It is much more a record than a song, with the production embellish-ments counting more than the melody and lyrics.
