



Neither the ordinary apple label nor the custom label is actually a second printing. The fact that the promotional copies appear on the green Apple label with a design that is somewhat similar to the commercial Apple releases lead people to believe that the star label came second. However, the tie-in to the *Ringo* album from 1973 points toward the custom label as being first.

As label design sheets from November 20, 1973, illustrate, Capitol was preparing the star label prior to the release date and very nearly made promotional copies using that label. However, they opted to use the traditional Apple label instead.
