Already riding high on the charts, Ringo's remake of the Platters' giant hit from nearly 15 years ago, with his distinctive vocals and odd but catchy arrangement, could well be the biggest thing he's come up with since "Photograph." 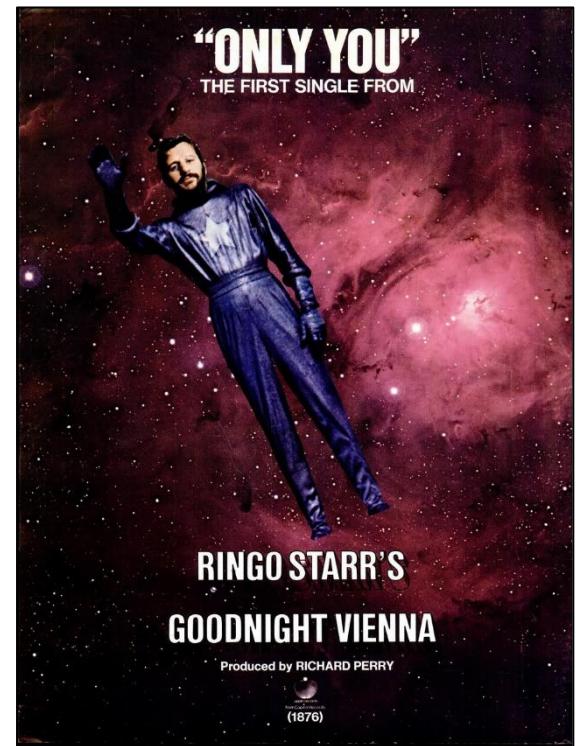

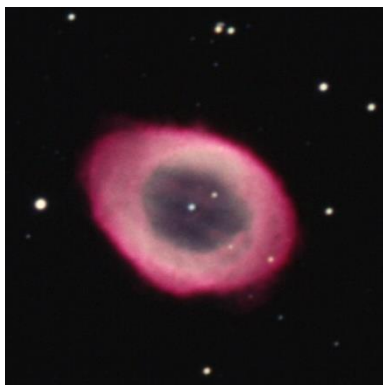

The label design is based on a September 1973 photograph of the Ring Nebula (Messier M57). Bill Schoening took the photograph on September 1, 1973, using the Kitt Peak 4m telescope. The image was reflected. Here is an image of the original photograph (from the NOAO/AURA/NSF). Discovered in 1779, the Ring Nebula was the first known planetary nebula. It is located just outside the constellation Lyra, between β Lyrae and γ Lyrae.

RINGO STARR (Apple 1876)

Only You (3:16) (TRO-Hollis, BMI — Buck Ram — Ande Rand)

From Ringo's forthcoming "Goodnight Vienna" LP, this 1955 Platters classic has been updated superstar style. With Ringo singing lead and John doing some background harmonies the tempo has been upped from the original. The timing is just right for this disc and with Ringo's track record of the last year we know where this one will go. Richard Perry produced. Flip: Call Me (4:05) (Richoroony Ltd., BMI — Richard Starkey).

Neither the ordinary apple label nor the custom label is a second printing.

NOTE: There is a secret message near the end of the A-side. As Ringo is singing "you're my dream come true, my one, my one and only you," Harry Nilsson sings in reverse "[Get some] money, money, money."
